Guarding the Government

Each year, the federal government loses billions of dollars to waste, fraud and abuse of taxpayer funds. These actions—also known as *qui tam* lawsuits—let private citizens sue on behalf of the government and share in the recovery of government dollars. Common False Claims Act cases include overcharging the government, billing for services that were never provided, paying kickbacks, or otherwise violating federal regulatory requirements.
