The *Fitness Champs Holdings Ltd.* class action lawsuit was filed on behalf of those who purchased or otherwise acquired *Fitness Champs Holdings Ltd.* ("FCHL") (NASDAQ: FCHL) securities between September 3, 2025 and September 23, 2025, inclusive (the "Class Period"). Captioned *Lim Yen Nee v. Fitness Champs Holdings Ltd.*, No. 26-cv-03182 (S.D.N.Y.), the FCHL class action lawsuit alleges that FCHL and/or certain of its officers and/or directors violated federal securities laws by making false or misleading statements and/or omitted to disclose material information.

COMPLAINT ALLEGATION SUMMARY:

The complaint alleges that, throughout the Class Period, Defendants made materially false and/or misleading statements, as well as failed to disclose material facts about the company's business, operations, and prospects. Specifically, Defendants misrepresented and/or failed to disclose that: (1) FCHL was the subject of a market manipulation and fraudulent promotion scheme involving social-media based misinformation and impersonators posing as financial professionals; (2) as a result, FCHL securities were at unique risk of a sustained suspension in trading by NASDAQ and severe volatility-induced decline; (3) the sole underwriter on the IPO conducted numerous microcap IPOs that suffered volatility-induced declines resulting from market manipulation schemes; (4) as a result of the foregoing, Defendants' statements about the company's business, operations, and prospects were materially false and misleading and/or lacked a reasonable basis at all relevant times.

WHY DID FCHL'S STOCK DROP?

On September 23, 2025, FCHL's stock price suddenly dropped after rising to as high as \$7.20 per share a few days prior, despite no fundamental news to justify the fluctuations.



Investigations and reports revealed that *FCHL* was utilized in a market manipulation scheme, also known as a pump-and-dump. On this news, *FCHL*'s stock price fell more than 84%.

THE LEAD PLAINTIFF PROCESS:

The Private Securities Litigation Reform Act of 1995 permits any investor who purchased or acquired *FCHL* securities during the Class Period to seek appointment as lead plaintiff in the *FCHL* class action lawsuit. A lead plaintiff is a representative party that acts on behalf of other class members in directing the litigation. In order to be appointed lead plaintiff, the Court must determine that the class member's claim is typical of the claims of other class members, and that the class member will adequately represent the class. Your ability to share in any recovery is not, however, affected by the decision whether or not to serve as a lead plaintiff. Filling out the online form above or communicating with any counsel is not necessary to participate or share in any recovery achieved in this case. Any member of the purported class may move the court to serve as a lead plaintiff through counsel of his/her choice, or may choose to do nothing and remain an inactive class member.
