The *United Homes Group, Inc.* class action lawsuit was filed on behalf of those who purchased or otherwise acquired *United Homes Group, Inc.* ("*United Homes*") (NASDAQ: UHG) securities between May 19, 2025 and February 22, 2026, inclusive (the "Class Period"). Captioned *Ramesh Kadiyam v. United Homes Group, Inc.*, No. 26-cv-02989 (S.D.N.Y.), the *United Homes* class action lawsuit alleges that *United Homes* and/or certain of its officers and/or directors violated federal securities laws by making false or misleading statements and/or omitted to disclose material information.

COMPLAINT ALLEGATION SUMMARY:

The complaint alleges that, throughout the Class Period, Defendants made materially false and/or misleading statements, as well as failed to disclose material facts about the company's business, operations, and prospects. Specifically, Defendants misrepresented and/or failed to disclose that: (1) *United Homes's* controlling shareholder intended to force a sale of the company; (2) the controlling shareholder was taking actions to devalue the company and its financial condition; (3) the controlling shareholder leveraged his controlling interest to effectuate that sale, including by effectively forcing the dissident directors to resign; and (4) as a result of the foregoing, Defendants' statements about the company's business, operations, and prospects were materially false and misleading and/or lacked a reasonable basis at all relevant times.

WHY DID UNITED HOMES'S STOCK DROP?

On February 23, 2026, *United Homes* announced that it had agreed to become a wholly owned subsidiary of another company called Stanley Martin Homes, LLC, in a transaction that would cash out all stockholders for consideration of \$1.18 per share. On this news, the price of *United Homes* stock fell more than 51%.



THE LEAD PLAINTIFF PROCESS:

The Private Securities Litigation Reform Act of 1995 permits any investor who purchased or acquired *United Homes* securities during the Class Period to seek appointment as lead plaintiff in the *United Homes* class action lawsuit. A lead plaintiff is a representative party that acts on behalf of other class members in directing the litigation. In order to be appointed lead plaintiff, the Court must determine that the class member's claim is typical of the claims of other class members, and that the class member will adequately represent the class. Your ability to share in any recovery is not, however, affected by the decision whether or not to serve as a lead plaintiff. Filling out the online form above or communicating with any counsel is not necessary to participate or share in any recovery achieved in this case. Any member of the purported class may move the court to serve as a lead plaintiff through counsel of his/her choice, or may choose to do nothing and remain an inactive class member.
